

About the park

A 700-acre reservoir offering canoeing, boating, and fishing is the main attraction of this park. The reservoir is stocked by the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission with sunshine bass. An abundance of channel catfish, largemouth bass, blue gill, and black crappie also make their home in the reservoir.

A disc golf course gives disc enthusiasts a chance to test their skills, while the sand volleyball court provides players a scenic view. A three-mile equestrian trail through pine flatwoods and hardwood hammocks is another feature of this park.

Campers can stay overnight at one of the 40 first-come, first-serve campsites that accommodate both RV and tent camping. All campsites have a picnic table, electricity, a fire ring, and water. Campground restrooms with showers, and an RV dump station are also available to registered campers.
